Seat History Unknown

If the history is unknown the car seat should not be used.

Car Seat Expired

Exposure to sunlight and extreme temperatures can damage the plastic and webbing in car seats. Car seats cannot be used longer than six years unless otherwise stated by the manufacturer. This information can be found on the seats' label.

Go Green with Safe Kids

Drop off your unused/unsafe car seat at Safe Kids Grand Forks to be recycled at 860 S. Columbia Road, Monday through Friday, 8 a.m. - 5 p.m.

Car Seats Involved in a Vehicle Crash

Visit www.nhtsa.gov to determine if your car seat needs to be replaced after a crash. Contact your insurance company for reimbursement information for a new car seat.

Missing or Broken Parts of Car Seat

If anything is missing or broken, contact the manufacturer to determine if the part is replaceable or if the car seat needs to be replaced.

Car Seats are Sometimes Recalled

To check for recalls or to obtain registration information, visit, www.nhtsa.gov. Submit your registration card to be notified of a recall.
